Being Safe on computing equipment.



How can you make sure you're safe when you're using computers, mobile phones or tablets.

Why do we use these devices?

- Computers let us find information quickly, share this info and present our work in an exciting way.
- Mobile phones allow us to talk to people on the move – in an emergency they can be very helpful.
- Tablets are easier to move around than computers but still allow us to search for info and communicate with others on the move.
- Games consoles also allow us to communicate with other people while we play our favourite games.

Why is the internet so useful?

- We can quickly get on the internet from most electronic devices nowadays.
- It's very quick and easy to search for information on the things you want to know about.
- It's much cheaper to simply use the internet than buying a book on all of these different topics.

What can we use the Web for?

1. At school and home, we can use the internet to **search for information** for work or things that we are interested in. We might use a search engine such as:



To avoid seeing or reading something upsetting, we recommend that you use Swiggle or Kidrex to search for information online.

- You must read the information and then write it out yourself in your own words.



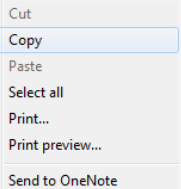

2. We might search for **videos** relating to something we're interested in, using websites like:



Youtube searches can often show nasty videos that will upset or scare you. To avoid these issues, we recommend Kidstube to watch and share your own videos or the CBBC player to watch your favourite TV shows.

Don't forget though: If you see something that worries you online, shut the lid if possible and tell an adult straight away. They will sort the computer out for you.

What can we use the internet for?

3. We may use internet sites to **talk to our friends** and share our experiences. Social Networks and email websites allow us to do this easily.



Everything that you post on these websites can be viewed by the people who run them. They may share this info with people that you don't know so never post anything you don't want everyone to know about!

You are only supposed to join Facebook if you are 13 years or older. People have been charged by the police for sharing offensive things and being nasty to people online.

We recommend you use the KLZ email to talk to your friends online and you can also send work into school this way...

What can we use the internet for?

4. We may use an internet connection to play games online with other people.

If you want to play with friends online, make sure that you speak in person with them and get their account name this way. Make sure you know each other's account names so you know who is adding you.

Don't accept requests to add people if you do not know who they are. They may lie about who they are and use these games as a way to get personal information from you.

Cyber-bullying

- Cyber bullying is any deliberate act, where someone makes another person upset or angry by communicating nasty things to them online.
- This can be via texts, computer messages, emails, phone calls or through online games.
- At this school we will not allow cyber-bullying towards our pupils or by our pupils. Pupils who do this will not be allowed to use computers in school.
- There is always evidence stored by websites and the Police will be involved if necessary.



What to do....

- If you are being bullied online or on your phone then you must **speak** to an **adult** straight away!
- **Save** any messages that you receive and print them if possible as evidence for our investigation.
- **NEVER respond or retaliate** – this will only get you in trouble and might make the bully even more aggressive to you.



Mobile Phones

- Mobile phones can be useful in emergencies, if we are lost or need to talk to somebody.
- Mobile phones are not permitted to be used in school by pupils.
- If you need to speak to your parents when you're in school, the School Office can help you to ring them on the school phone.
- If you're using your phone at home, make sure you only communicate with parents and friends that you already know and have communicated with in person.
- Make sure that you don't use your phone to be unkind to other people. Cyberbullying is **completely unacceptable** and will result in serious sanctions at school, whether it is done in or out of school. In many cases around the country, the Police have become involved.

Only give out your contact details to parents and people you are friends with and trust.
