# Headlines

Newspaper headlines are designed to attract the reader's attention.

- Use dramatic or emotional words, such as:

Crisis Drama Clash Fury Battle Row

- Alliteration – 'Pick up a Penguin'
- Puns – 'Kentucky Freed Chicken' (Jokes)
- Rhymes/half rhymes – 'St Helen's Glass has the class'  
'Beanz Meanz Heinz'

# What are the key features of a newspaper?

- Let's create our own list of what MUST be included within a newspaper.
- Make sure you fully understand what each section means
- Why do we include those within our work?
- What is the impact upon the reader?
- Who are we writing this for?

# Get a copy of First News in your pairs

- Who is it written for? How can you tell?

- Look at the layout – what do you notice? What's the impact of this?
- What does the paper include?
- How do they start and finish the article?
